

This marked a significant milestone in their journey. Undeterred by the challenges, they returned in 2023 to triumphantly claim the top spot as the winners of the ROSL competition.

As the Symbios Quartet continues to captivate audiences with their innovative blend of genres and commitment to musical exploration, they remain a driving force in shaping the cultural landscape of Perth and beyond. With each performance, the quartet invites listeners on a transformative journey, demonstrating the power of symbiotic collaboration in the world of music.

Performer and Assoc. Music Director

Nikki Demandolx is a saxophonist, PhD candidate and tutor in classical saxophone studies at WAAPA currently based in Perth. She completed a Bachelor of Music (Hons) in performance in Brisbane and worked for a few years as a saxophonist and teacher before moving to Sydney to complete a Masters in Music Studies at Sydney Conservatorium under the tutelage of Dr. Michael Duke.

Currently, she is in her final year of her PhD candidate at WAAPA exploring performance health and wellbeing for the saxophonist, investigating principles from sports science and yoga to encourage peak performance whilst minimising injury. Although all-things saxophone is her favourite thing, she is also an avid long-distance runner and enjoys coffee a little too much.

Nikki is the 'Phone Co. Associate Musical Director, will be directing the Baritone Madness and running the Sax Athletics workshop.

Assoc Prof Jamie Oehlers



Performer and festival presenter

Dr Jamie Oehlers is one of Australia's leading jazz artists and saxophonists. In 2003 he won the World Saxophone Competition, and has won numerous awards in Australia, including 4 Australian Jazz "Bell" Awards, an ABC Limelight Award, an Australian Young Achiever of the Year award, and multiple ARIA nominations. His groups have performed around the world at major festivals like the JVC Jazz

Festival in New York, London Jazz Festival, Montreux Jazz Festival and the Edinburgh Jazz Festival.

After completing his studies at WAAPA, Jamie furthered his study at Berklee College of Music in Boston, under scholarship. He has been a saxophone and improvisation tutor at multiple universities since 1998, and regularly holds saxophone and improvisation workshops throughout Australia, USA, Japan, New Zealand and the UK and is a staff member in the jazz department at WAAPA. He has recently completed his PhD on reflexive practice within improvisation and has launched his new album 'Between the Lines of Stillness'.

Dr Matt Styles



WAAPA Massed Sax Festival director, presenter and performer

One of the truly versatile saxophonists in Australia, Matt can seamlessly traverse, jazz, classical, funk, avant-garde as a performer, educator, arranger, composer and musical director. Describing himself as a performing educator, this artist has inspired audiences and students in the UK, Asia and Australia and appears on numerous jazz,

classical and cross-genre recordings and released an album of Australian cross-genre works on Tall Poppies Records entitled *Home by 11*.

The Malaysian Philharmonic, Singapore Symphony Western Australian Symphony, Tasmanian Symphony, Perth Symphony and Orchestras have also utilised Matt as their principal saxophonist. Every year since 1997, Matt has given Australian or World premiere performances of classical and 'cross-genre' works specifically arranged or composed for him in his capacity as a unique soloist and improviser, including giving the Australian premiere of Mark-Anthony Turnage's Hidden Love Song as soloist with the Western Australian Symphony Orchestra.

Following post-graduate studies at the Royal College of Music, London, he received a *Churchill Fellowship* enabling him to study with Dr Otis Murphy, Dr Tom Walsh, Bob Berg and Dr Eugene Rousseau, and received his doctorate in the interpretation, pedagogy and performance of classical, jazz and multi-genre or 'cross-over' works.

He is passionate about Injury prevention and rehabilitation for the sax and continues to research this area, presenting his findings in the UK, Asia and Australia.

Recognising his unique talents, the Western Australian Symphony Orchestra (WASO) have commissioned Holly Harrison to write an exciting saxophone concerto for Matt; the world premiere being held on August 9th and 10th, 2024 at the Perth Concert Hall.

In 2024, he has very kindly donated his work, 'Impulse' to the Massed Sax orchestra library and will be giving the winner of the Sax Ensemble Composition Competition and online individual lifechanging composition workshop.

Andy has a lifelong passion for music and over 30

years experience of initiating creative projects. He is a highly versatile contemporary musician, with a distinctive saxophonic and compositional voice that encompasses elements of jazz, world and contemporary classical styles. Andy Scott is multi-nominated and winner of a prestigious BASCA British Composer Award, works to commission, and is increasingly in demand to write for leading instrumentalists and ensembles on the world stage. He teaches on the composition and saxophone departments at the Royal Northern College of Music, is a popular course leader and gives classes and workshops worldwide. As well as being a band leader with his own groups and projects, Andy is regularly invited to guest lead and direct large groups and creative projects.

Based in Perth, Australia, her compositions have been performed at prestigious festivals around the world including Mostly Modern Festival (USA), Atlantic Music Festival (USA), and The World Saxophone Congress (Scotland). She is 2024's Composer in Residence at Gallop House in Perth, courtesy of the Peggy Glanville-Hicks Composers Trust. Suzanne is currently in America courtesy of a DLGSC grant, to attend the world premiere of her latest choral piece "Elokai Netzor" in Minneapolis, and receive composition lessons in Boston. Suzanne has been a great friend to the WAAPA saxophone studio and to the Massed Sax Orchestra over many years. Suzanne has very generously arranged the 2nd movement of her incredible orchestral work, Jacob's Ladder for the Massed Sax Orchestra.


