

APPLICATION PROCESS

All applicants should be familiar with the process outlined here. Further details, relevant to each course, are provided in the sections below.

Apply online through [ECU's Application Portal](#) by the closing date and pay the application fee.

Candidates who are Year 12 ATAR students in Western Australia **do not need to apply to TISC**, instead apply direct to WAAPA through ECU's applicant portal.

APPLICATION PROCESS AND FEES

Applying:

To apply follow the link from the [Arts and Cultural Management page](#) on the WAAPA website. The link will take you to the Edith Cowan University [applicant portal](#) where you will be asked to create an account and then lodge your application. After you have completed the application and made the necessary payment you will be contacted by email and given the appointment details for your interview.

Please attach:

- Your latest academic transcripts (school reports). Many applicants will not yet have completed Year 12 so their final report will not be available. In this case, we need your most recent school report (usually mid-year)
- A brief performance or training resume outlining your previous experience in this area, (2 A4 pages max).
- Please do not attach anything further to the above as this will not be taken into consideration.

Academic Entrance Requirements (IMPORTANT):

In addition to passing the interview applicants must also meet Edith Cowan University academic entrance requirements for their particular course (Diploma or Bachelor) to get a formal offer of a place from ECU. Applicants who are concerned they do not meet Edith Cowan University's entrance requirements and will not meet these requirements upon completion of their current course of study should contact Future Study for details on alternative pathways. It is important you complete the section on the application form relating to your academic qualifications and attach the documents requested.

Application fee:

Fees for this course for 2024 have been waived. More information is available on the [WAAPA website](#).

WAAPA would like to encourage applications from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. There are application fee scholarships available for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander applicants who indicate that on their application.

Student Accommodation:

If you wish to stay at student housing you must make a separate application to the Student Housing office at Edith Cowan University (www.mystudentvillage.com/au/ecuvillage). **Do not wait until you are informed of your interview result or you have made up your mind whether you wish to come to WAAPA before applying.** Places are very limited and to have the best chance of success you should apply straight away regardless of your current intentions.

If you wish to contact ECU with questions or queries you may do so via the [online enquiry form](#). Please make sure you reference your name, application number and course.

Application closing date:

Applications officially close on **29 September 2023**. You are encouraged to apply prior to this date to avoid disappointment, however applications for Bachelor of Arts (Arts and Cultural Management) made after this are still considered at the Course Coordinator's discretion.





OFFERS, ENROLMENT AND ORIENTATION

Offers:

You will receive an email regarding the outcome of your interview once this has been determined, and the Student Hub will advise the Admissions Office.

If you receive a 'successful' notification email from ECU and you meet the entry requirements, an official letter of offer will follow soon after.

If you have a successful interview, but do not meet ECU's academic and/or English entry requirements, you will not be made an offer and you will be notified of your options by TISC or ECU.

Enrolment:

Before Orientation in early February, all students should enrol in the appropriate units online. Staff are available to assist students in this process. Any further queries can be addressed to the Student Hub via the [online enquiry form](#). Please make sure you reference your name, application number and course.

Orientation:

It is essential that you attend the rigorous Orientation program for your course at ECU. Details of the Orientation will be available on the website closer to start of semester.

ARTS AND CULTURAL MANAGEMENT INTERVIEW REQUIREMENTS

The Interview:

You will be required to attend an interview, either on campus or online via Zoom. During the interview, you will be asked questions about your experience, motivation and goals. It is important that you have an existing interest and background in arts and culture, along with a commitment to extending your knowledge in management and leadership for the arts and creative industries.

Application Outcomes (all applicants):

When all applicants are assessed, the results are processed as quickly as possible, and you will be notified of the results by email. All applicants are notified by email or phone call of the result of their application before Christmas.

Unfortunately, it is not possible to give individual feedback on matters relating to your interview.
